



SUNDAVILLE® Mandevilla

Sundaville® Mandevilla makes an ideal conservatory and outdoor summer patio plant. Plants can be grown in tubs, window boxes or hanging baskets. Mandevilla is also known as dipladenia and is a climbing plant with a classification of a tender perennial, so in our climate it will require frost protection. They are a native of Central and South America and are tolerant to heat and cool northern European conditions.

GROWING INSTRUCTIONS

On purchase of your plug plants you should carefully unwrap the plants from any packaging and let them acclimatisate for 24hrs by placing the plants in light but away from direct sunlight. Check if they need watering. It is likely they will need some water before potting on (never pot up a dry plant). You can water from underneath the plant or overhead but make sure the whole plant is moist. After 24 hours, pot the plant up into a pot size of around 9-10cm (3.5 – 4 inches) maximum, use any universal potting mix or standard potting mix. Avoid loam based compost as it needs to be free draining. Fill the pot first with compost to the top of the pot. Then with your fingers make a hole in the top in the centre of the pot and place the plug in. The top of the plug needs to be on the same level as the top of the compost, so don't bury parts of the stem or foliage as it may rot. Water the plant thoroughly after potting, then place in a nice bright place, window, conservatory, greenhouse etc. Allow the plant to dry out between watering in the first 2-3 weeks, then once the roots have run to the edge of the pot they can be kept more moist. Feed after 2-3 weeks with a standard feed, such as Baby Bio, Phostrogen etc. After about 7-10 weeks the plant will need moving onto a larger pot.

POTTING ON

Pot the plant into a larger pot size, upwards of 2 inches at a time. When required, usually once a year in the spring, use a free draining potting compost. You can add a slow release fertiliser such as Osmocote to give long lasting feed levels. We recommend that a Sundaville® is kept in a pot as this allows the freedom to move the plant in and outside to ensure protection against severe weather. At this point the plant will need a support system when you pot, this can be either bamboo canes or a trellis of some type which will all be available in your local garden centre. Again just after potting, water the plant in having made sure it is moist when potted, then allow it to dry out between watering.

HEIGHT CONTROL

If you want to control the height of the plant, pinching the plant to get the correct shape is recommended. Be aware that if you pinch hard at every shoot you will remove the flower buds which appear at the leaf joints at approx, every 2-5 pairs of leaves. Always identify the flower buds before pinching. For support for the climbing shoots you can train the shoots up a trellis or similar support system.

POSITION

Sundaville® can be placed in full sun or partial shade. When used inside they will thrive in as much natural light as possible. Light levels are important for re-flowering in the following year. Flowers can be seen in the UK up to Christmas, if the plant is given the correct conditions as an example. If your plant is outside please bring it indoors before the first frosts and place in a well lit area free from frosts. A heated greenhouse, protected porch, or cold or heated conservatory are ideal.

WATERING & WINTER CARE

Sundaville® is tolerant of wet or dry conditions in the summer and can go safely a week or more without water if necessary. Watering regularly in the summer when it is dry allowing it to dry out between watering, is ideal. Ad feed at least once a week in the form of tomato feed, if you have not used a slow release fertiliser in the compost. From early November dry the plant completely out, especially if it is being overwintered in a cold environment. Only water lightly approximately once a month until better weather in the spring around late Feb, early March. Keep the plant dusty dry, they very rarely wilt.
